Central Districts Police Investigation Support Unit

- Supervisor and 4 staff (full strength)
- Cover the Central Districts Area.
- 600 files received a month on average.
- We assess the incoming complaints, offending and trends.
- Prepare the files for suspects to be located and arrested if they meet an evidential standard.




Palmerston North

- Based on Auror data, in 2023 our CBD has been as high as second (worst) in retail crime reports.
- The CBD sits in the top 10 suburbs alongside areas such as Manukau, Mangere, Onehunga, Whangarei, Hastings, Chartwell, Papanui.
- Retail Crime reporting has stabilised over the last 3 months and depends on incarceration of a select group.



Palmerston North

- Manawatu has 60% of the Central District retail crime. 50% aligns with the population and other crime types.
- One Palmerston North retailer is typically in the <u>top ten NZ sites</u> and often has over 100 reported events a month.
- A different Palmerston North retailer can report a loss as high as \$15,000 a month (during the pre-Xmas period 2022 and 2023).
- Supermarkets follow as top victim sites.



Palmerston North

- Offending increases December to January.
- Friday is the highest risk day.
- 2pm 5pm is the high risk period.
- Assaults at retail locations have not shown an increase over the last year.
- Youth are involved in less than 20% of the events.

This is potentially lower than expected as youths often present in a group and mostly offend in the CBD area.

Adults are more likely to offend individually and across the city.
